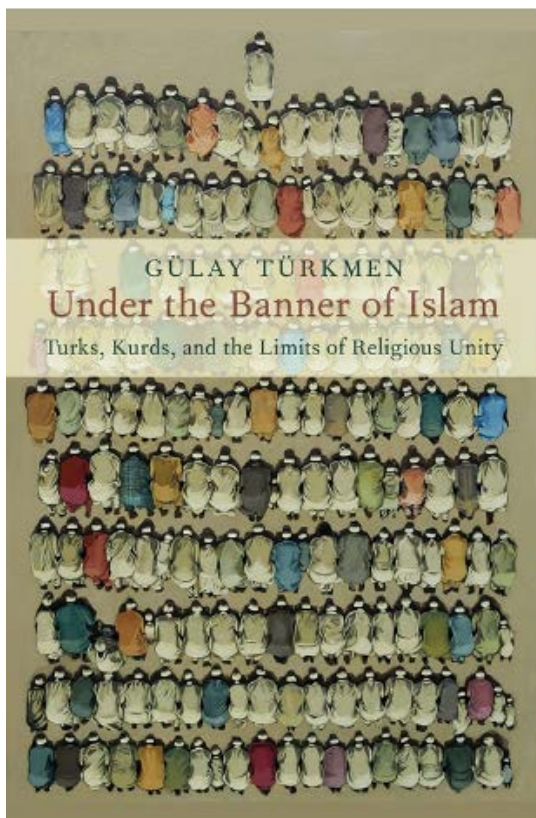
### Online Book Launch

Is it possible for religion to act as a resolution tool in violent conflicts? **Dr. Gülay Türkmen's** book “Under the Banner of Islam” uses Turkey as a case study to understand how religious, ethnic, and national identities converge in ethnic conflicts between co-religionists. The book tells a specific story of religion, ethnicity, and nationalism in Turkey's Kurdish conflict, but it also tracks a broader narrative of how ethnic and religious identities are negotiated when resolving conflict.

**Dr. Gülay Türkmen** is a postdoctoral researcher at the University of Graz's Center for Southeast European Studies and a visiting researcher at the Max Planck Institute for the Study of Religious and Ethnic Diversity.

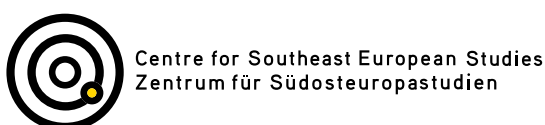
